The festivities begin at 4 p.m. at the Unionville Museum at 15 School Street with the annual Yuletide Open House to enjoy refreshments and view holiday trees, wreaths, garlands, and centerpieces designed by local businesses and civic groups. Bring the kids and stop by the First Church of Christ Congregational Unionville at 61 Main Street for craft making and enjoy games and holiday cookie decorating at the Farmington Youth Center and Annex. At 5:30 p.m., all are invited to gather at the gazebo in Alice Clover Pinney Park on School Street for a traditional carol sing led by First Church of Christ Choir followed by a special visit from Santa at 5:45 p.m.
